

**SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE HAWAII TECHNOLOGY ACADEMY JULY 01, 2017 PUBLIC CHARTER
SCHOOL CONTRACT**

I.

II. **Background**

This Second Amendment to the July 01, 2017 Public Charter School Contract (the “Amendment”) effective as of July 01, 2022 (the “Effective Date”), is by and between the **STATE PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL COMMISSION** located at 1164 Bishop Street, Suite 1100, Honolulu, Hawaii, 96813 (the “Commission”), and **HAWAII TECHNOLOGY ACADEMY** whose mailing address is 94-450 MOKUOLA ST WAIPAHU HAWAI’I 96797, (the “School”), (collectively “Parties”).

WHEREAS, the State Public Charter School Commission and Hawaii Technology Academy (the “Parties”) entered into a Public Charter School Contract effective July 01, 2017 (the “Charter Contract”) for the purposes of authorizing Hawaii Technology Academy as a public charter school in the state of Hawaii;

WHEREAS, the Commission on November 12, 2020, unanimously passed a Motion to Extend the current Charter Contract for one year, this First Amendment to the Public Charter School Contract allows both the commission and the School time to implement and participate in the renewal process;

WHEREAS, in response to changing times and the impact of COVID-19 on the school’s students and parents, HTA submitted a request to amend the Exhibit “A” Educational Program of the School’s Public Charter School Contract to add a Virtual Learning program, with approximately 195 additional students for School Year 2022-2023 and beyond;

WHEREAS, on January 13, 2022, the Commission unanimously approved the School’s amendment request to Exhibit “A” Educational Program which included the updating of instructional sites and the addition of a Virtual Learning Program subject to a letter from the Attorney General setting forth a plan for review and recommendation for action on the school’s leases;

WHEREAS, on February 10, 2022 the Commission passed a motion unanimously to accept the Attorney General letter as fulfilling the requirements that Commission required on January 13, 2022 and approved the School’s request to amend the Exhibit “A” Educational Program;

WHEREAS, effective July 01, 2022, the parties agree to Amend the July 01, 2017 Public Charter School Contract and to the following changes set forth in this Second Amendment, it is hereby understood and agreed as follows,

III. Amendments

Exhibit "A" Educational Program

The Amended Exhibit "A" Educational Program for the Hawaii Technology Academy shall reflect an update to instructional sites listed, the addition of a Virtual Learning Program, and resulting changes in the Blended Learning Program as follows:

Virtual Learning Program

- Addition of a Virtual Learning Program.
- Maximum enrollment of 234 students.
- Maximum percentage of the total student population enrolled in the Virtual Learning Program is 15%.
- Grades served by the Virtual Learning Program are 4-12.

Blended Learning Program

- Maximum enrollment would be 1492 students, although the target enrollment is 1371.
- Maximum percentage of the total student population enrolled in the Blended Program is 87%.
- Grades served by the Blended Program are K-12.




