

**SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE KE KULA NIIHAU O KEKAHA LEARNING CENTER JULY 01, 2017 3.0
CHARTER CONTRACT**

I. Background

This Second Amendment to Extend the July 01, 2017 3.0 Charter Contract (the "Amendment") dated as of July 01, 2022 (the "Effective Date"), is by and between the State Public Charter School Commission located at 1140 Bishop Street, Suite 1100, Honolulu, Hawaii, 96813 (the "Commission"), and Ke Kula Niihau O Kekaha Learning Center, whose mailing address is P.O. Box 129 Kekaha, Hawaii 96752, (the "School"), (collectively the "Parties").

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into a 3.0 Charter Contract effective July 01, 2017 (the "Charter Contract") for the purposes of authorizing Ke Kula Niihau O Kekaha Learning Center as a public charter school in the state of Hawaii; under its original terms, the Charter Contract expired on June 30, 2021; and

WHEREAS, for reasons including closures due to COVID-19, the Commission and the School need additional time to implement and participate in the renewal process; and

WHEREAS, the Commission on October 08, 2020, unanimously passed a Motion to Extend the current Charter Contract for one year, ending on June 30, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has not reviewed the School for renewal which if granted would award a new contract to begin on July 01, 2022 (the "New Charter Contract"); and

WHEREAS, for reasons including the continued impact of COVID-19 on State assessments and the lack of reliable data to make high stakes decisions on renewal, the Commission and the School need additional time to implement and participate in the renewal process; and

WHEREAS, the Commission on October 28, 2021, unanimously passed a Motion to Extend the Current Charter Contract for one year, ending on June 30, 2023; and

WHEREAS, effective July 01, 2022, the parties agree to extend the July 1, 2017 Charter Contract and to the following changes set forth in this Amendment, it is hereby understood and agreed as follows,

II. Amendments

Terms:

The following amendments are agreed to by the parties and added to the July 01, 2017 Charter Contract, in replacement of the corresponding portion of each section or exhibit referenced below:

Section 2.3 Term: A one year extension of the July 01, 2017 Charter Contract signed by the parties June 30, 2017 and attached hereto, **shall commence on July 01, 2022 and will terminate on June 30, 2023.**

Exhibit B Academic Performance Framework: All of the targets for academic proficiency, academic growth, college and career readiness, and achievement gap set forth for Ke Kula Niihau O Kekaha Learning Center for school year 2020-2021 shall apply to school year 2021-2022 and school year 2022-2023, and are as follows:

I. Student Academic Outcomes

1. Academic Proficiency

Ke Kula Niihau O Kekaha Learning Center (KKNOK) will strive for improved student academic proficiency each year of the contract in language arts and math. Specific targets for achievement will be set when sufficient baseline data is available.

In SY 2017-2018 the school's proficiency rates will be based on Kaiapuni Assessment of Educational Outcomes (KĀEO) results for the 3rd and 4th graders and Smarter Balance Assessment (SBA) results for 8th and 11th graders.

In SY 2018-2019 the school's proficiency rates will be based on KĀEO results for 3rd through 5th graders and SBA results for 8th and 11th graders.

In SY 2019-2020 the school's proficiency rates will be based on KĀEO results for 3rd through 6th graders (pending development of KĀEO) and SBAC results for 8th and 11th graders.

In SY 2020-2021, the school's proficiency rates will be based on KĀEO results for 3rd through 7th graders

(pending development of KĀEO) and SBAC results for 8th and 11th graders.
