Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer (P-EBT) Food Assistance Program FAQ for Schools (for internal purposes only)



The Department of Human Services (DHS) is the lead agency for the P-EBT Program. The following are questions schools may receive in regards to the P-EBT Program. Who is eligible to receive P-EBT?

Hawaii households are eligible if they have students who are either eligible for free or reduced-price school meals **OR** enrolled in a school that provides free meals to all students through the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) or another provision.

Do I need to apply for P-EBT?

No, the Hawaii State Department of Education (HIDOE) will provide information for all eligible students directly to DHS. Households do not have to apply for P-EBT.

If I already qualified for free and reduced-price school meals but I plan to move or have recently moved, what should I do?

Contact your child's school to update your primary address. HIDOE will then update DHS on your changed address.

What are the deadlines to apply for free and reduced-price school meals?

To receive the P-EBT cards, free and reduced-price school meals applications and address changes must be submitted by the following deadlines:

- **September 15:** Deadline for hard-copy free and reduced-price school meal applications to the school (hard copies available at the school office)
- September 21: Deadline for online free and reduced-price school meals applications
- September 22: Deadline to submit address changes to the school

How do I know if I am eligible for free and reduced-price meals?

The household size and income criteria identified below for 2020-2021 school year will be used to determine eligibility for free and reduced-price benefits. Children from households whose income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for free or reduced-price meals.

Under the provisions of the free and reduced-price policy, the Department will review applications and determine eligibility. Parents or guardians may discuss the decision on an application with the reviewing official on an informal basis. More information here.

How will I get the P-EBT funds?

The Hawaii Kokua Card (EBT) system is used to provide funds to ALL eligible students. Families receiving SNAP and/or cash assistance from DHS and already have a Kokua Card will have these additional funds added to their existing cards. Families who do not already have a Kokua Card will receive a pre-loaded Hawaii P-EBT card in the mail; thus, it is important that changes in mailing addresses be submitted to the schools by September 15, 2020.

If I have more than one child, will I get different cards for each child?

All eligible students located at the same address on file with HIDOE will be under one Hawaii P-EBT card with the card account under the name of the eldest child. Parents/guardians will need to activate the card by following the instructions that will be mailed with the card. In situations where adding the eligible student is not possible or appropriate, a separate card will be mailed for the eligible student.

My child's school still offers Grab-and-Go meals. Can I still get P-EBT?

Yes, if your children are eligible for P-EBT, you will receive the benefits even if you currently receive free meals from your school.

I share custody of my child. Which parent/guardian will receive the Hawaii P-EBT card? The Hawaii P-EBT card will be mailed to the primary address on file with the student's school.
